- providing regular support for people in the fellowship, as requested by the Pastors, through telephone contact and establishing a 'telephone visiting scheme'
- contributing to the administration requirements of the various groups within the church by preparing minutes of meetings, helping with the tape library, preparing the communion table
- contributing to the extensive service needs of the children and young people
- coordinating the support for one of the missionary couples linked to the church
- managing the very large team of stewards each Sunday
- being a member of the stewarding team
- becoming engaged in social concern and outreach within the town
- developing new ministries in partnership with other churches
- volunteering for project work or one-off events
- leading or hosting a home group
