

PORT HILL BABY & TODDLER CLUB

is one of the community activities run by Hertford Baptist Church. It is designed to provide a pleasant atmosphere in which adults, young children and babies can enjoy exploring different toys and activities together. Adults are responsible for the child/children they bring, whether as parent, relative, childminder, nanny or friend.

BABY & TODDLER CLUB PLACES

The toys and equipment at the club are mainly for children aged 0-3. When a child has settled in a pre-school group you are expected to give up your place. However, if a child has a younger brother or sister, the older child can continue to attend the club (but we do not cater for school age children).

If you want to join the club, please phone the registration secretary for further details.



ATTENDANCE

Members are asked to inform the leader of their own session if they are unable to attend regularly for any reason and when they intend to give up their place.

FEES

If members bring a child/children from families other than their own, an extra weekly fee is required. If this needs to become a regular occurrence, a termly membership fee is expected.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Occasionally photographs taken at the club are displayed on our notice board, in our annual report or in the church magazine. If you do not want photographs of your child(ren) used in this way you must let your session leader know.

SAFETY

- ★ Our club is fully insured, but each adult is responsible for their own child/children.
- ★ Please make yourself aware of fire exits and the position of fire extinguishers.
- ★ Smoking is not allowed on the premises.
- ★ To leave a session early, turn the handle of the outer door anticlockwise and push open. Make sure that the door shuts behind you so that the building is made secure again.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Organising team. The club is run by an organising team, which meets termly, consisting of five people from the church and three mothers, representing each of the sessions.

Car parking in Chambers Street is restricted during the day to resident permit holders only. The nearest public car parks are in St. Andrew Street, at Hartham, and in Port Vale behind Courtyard Arts.

Entrance. If you arrive after the door is locked, please press the rocker-switch by the door at the top of the ramp.

Clearing up. The hall is laid out and suitably equipped at the start of each session by helpers from the church. At the end of your session please help, if possible, to tidy up (Tuesday and Wednesday) or clear away (Friday).

Drinks are provided for adults and children during each session. Snacks are discouraged in the hall.

Nappy changing facilities are available in the separate toilet for the disabled.
Disposable nappies must be put into a nappy sack and placed in the lined bucket provided.
