Heroes of the Exodus

The Old Testament Exodus is a pattern for New Testament salvation

'Exodus Pattern'

A deliverance accomplished by God.

A deliverance from bondage & oppression to the freedom & dignity of sonship.

'Exodus Pattern'

A deliverance accomplished by God, through a human being.

A deliverance creating a lasting relationship between God & Israel; one of both privilege & responsibility.

Exodus words in the New Testament

redeem redemp-tion deliver freedom deliverance slavery

purchase

ransom

An example of Exodus Pattern in New Testament

Colossians 1:13-14

[God the Father] has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loss on y for we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

The human mediators of divine salvation

(22)Moses' parents (23)Moses (24-28)in three ways

Joseph

Structure of Hebrews 11:22-28

Joseph: Exodus of Israel & his bones

Moses' parents hid him: no fear of king's edict

Moses identifies with Israel: suffers disgrace for Christ

Moses left Egypt: no fear of king's anger

Moses celebrates Passover: salvation of Israel - Blood



spoke of the salvation of Israel and his own burial because he believed God's word to Abraham (Genesis 12:1-3)





Hebrews 11:22

Genesis 50:24-25



kept the Passover because he knew the destroyer would 'pass over' the Israelites and they would be saved.

Exodus 12:1-30 (esp. vss. 21-23 & 29-30)





Hebrews 11:28



saved Moses' life because they knew he was an extraordinary child and were they were not afraid of the king's edict





Hebrews 11:23

Exodus 2:2



left Egypt not fearing the king's anger and persevered because he saw him who is invisible





Hebrews 11:27


Exodus 2:15

<u>Moses</u>

refused luxury & chose suffering with the people and for Christ of greater value because he was looking towards his reward; i.e. salvation

Are we ready to defy authorities in order to do what is right? – *Moses Parents hiding him*







Are we ready to live in exile in order to further God's call on our lives? – Moses leaves Egypt





So?

Are we ready to identify ourselves with those who suffer, denying our own rights and suffering their fate? – Moses and Christ
