

Some more facts


Our solar system = Sun, Mercury,

 Possibly 2,000,000,000,000 galaxies in known universe



"Because there is a law such as gravity, the universe can and will create itself from nothing.



This picture of the universe, or multiverse, as it is called, explains the long-standing mystery of why the constants of nature appear to be finetuned for the emergence of life.






Contextual Background of Genesis 1

A different God


God is the one and only, non-created God, who is independent of creation

God creates "good"



A different God

No deification of natural world (lesser and greater lights, he also made the stars)



A different God

God creates the divine image to be born by human beings

God serves humanity not vice versa



So?

- God created the natural world
- The natural world is under God's control
- God is free
- God created sexuality and it is good
- God is a loving and serving God

Application

 There is no other God who deserves worship – let us worship Him alone
